About the Conference

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Monterey Bay is famous for its beautiful coastline and its many recreational attractions. This conference at the Embassy Suites Monterey Bay Seaside offers a rich learning opportunity in a pleasant and relaxing setting. Our speakers include nationally recognized experts in pediatrics and specialists from around the Bay Area as well as UCSF Benioff Children's Hospitals.

The program will provide pediatricians, family practitioners, nurses, nurse practitioners, and other allied health professionals with the latest information on the diagnosis, assessment, treatment and prevention of several social and environmental conditions of infants, children and adolescents.

Our speakers will discuss the following pediatric topics under the theme "Rising to the Challenge of Modern Pediatrics: Physical, Mental, and Social Health":

- The importance of using current COVID vaccine recommendations in pediatrics
- The benefits of applying principles of racial socialization when providing anticipatory guidance to parents
- Best practices to help children improve and maintain emotional regulation skills to manage mood symptoms
- An integrative approach to the management of children born extremely premature
- Dermatology: The latest guidelines for identifying and treating blisters and birthmarks

The conference format includes didactic sessions, case presentations, question/answer sessions, and breakout sessions.

OBJECTIVES

This symposium will enable the practitioner to:

- Identify follow-up needs for a child identified prenatally with a fetal anomaly.
- Describe the negative impact of racism on the academic, behavioral, and health outcomes of children.
- Recognize characteristics of different headache phenotypes based on the International Classification of Headache Disorders (ICHD-3) from the International Headache Society.
- Describe the current epidemiology of COVID-19 infections in children.
- Identify the differential diagnosis of blistering rashes in children of all ages from infancy to adolescence.
- Recognize the terminology used by young adults to describe their gender and sexual identities.
- Identify at least 2 lessons learned from the COVID-19 pandemic that can be used to help clinicians be better prepared for future pandemics.
- Manage nonurgent birthmarks like nevus sebaceous with active nonintervention.
- List medical screenings that are indicated for children born extremely premature, as they grow.
- Assess the unique trauma and stressors experienced by immigrant children at different stages of their migration and incorporate best practices to address these elements in care visits.
- Examine best practices for providing culturally humble pediatric care to youth with diverse sexual and gender identities.
- Examine ways in which a provider can integrate advocacy into their practice.
